VICE-PRESIDENT'S THOUGHTS

Are You Interested in Serving on the LV Ranch Board?

For the benefit of our newer members, please be aware that opportunities to serve on the LVRanch Board of Directors become available at each Annual Meeting in August. The LVRanch Board manages the expenditures of the membership's annual dues and is responsible for maintaining all aspects of the facility, including: upkeep of the Ranch House; the roads; restocking the fish; road and lot signage; lot rule compliance issues; processing new membership applications; all of the administrative and record keeping functions required to maintain a not-for-profit corporation; and, much more.

Serving on the Ranch Board doesn't mean that each individual Board member has to do all the work in an assigned area. Rather, it often involves coming up with a strategy for accomplishing individual tasks and often contracting with businesses who perform the type of work needed. For example, actual tax accountants prepare the corporate tax filings, general or specialized contractors typically perform the needed plumbing and electrical work, a road grader operator is typically retained to perform the major road repairs, etc. Accordingly, the Ranch Board functions best when its Board members have a wide-range of varying understandings and experiences.

The LVRanch Board is composed of nine volunteer members who each serve a three-year term. Those three-year terms are staggered so that three board member terms expire at each Annual Meeting in August. While some Board members are content with serving a subsequent term, a whole lot depends upon whether or not other lot members are willing to step-up and express their interest in serving a term on the LV Ranch Board. Here's your opportunity to do that. It's also important that you let us know of your interest in Ranch Board service well in advance of the Annual Meeting in August.

Just between the beaver ponds, right before the turn to Westcreek, a group of 3 moose were grazing on the side of the road. It looked like a larger female, with maybe her offspring from the last 2 years. We were able to get some good photos before slowly continuing our way into LVR. A great way to start the weekend.

Bears. For those of you following the news, a Colorado woman was recently killed (5/1) near Durango while walking her dog. Now, some of you may be thinking that Durango is a long way from LVR, which is true. However, LVR is definitely in bear territory. It is important to educate yourself and be appropriately prepared should you encounter a bear. A great resource is the Colorado Parks and Wildlife website (https://cpw.state.co.us/learn/Pages/LivingwithWildlifeWildBears.aspx). A short summary recap:

- **Stash Your Trash.** Use bear-proof containers when available. If they are full, double bag trash and lock it in your trunk or RV. Never leave trash outside.
- Store Attractants Safely. Store food, beverages and toiletries in airtight containers and lock in your trunk. Many bears have discovered that coolers, bags, and boxes are full of food; never leave them in your tent or anywhere a bear could see, smell or reach.
- **Keep a Clean Camp**. Bears are attracted to odors of all kinds and will investigate anything interesting in hopes of finding food.
- **Keep a Clean Tent**. Do not bring anything with an odor into your tent—that includes all foods, bever-ages, scented toiletries, gum, toothpaste, sunscreen, candles, and insect repellant. Do not sleep in the clothes you cooked in; store them with your food.
- Lock RVs and Vehicles. Close windows and lock your vehicle and RV when you leave your camp site and at night before you go to sleep.

Fish! Our annual fish stocking order has been received and so you can look forward to plenty of fun. Remember, the fishing limit is three fish per day per individual, and no more than ten fish per day per membership.

RANCH ROADS

The great news this spring is that we have had quite a bit of snow continuing over the last few months. Unfortunately, my plow truck has been broken down and in the repair shop quite a bit this winter.. I did not keep the roads as clear as I would have liked and could not help with driveways either. The bad news is the roads have taken quite a beating. We just had a very wet snow a couple of days ago and are due about 3 days of rain in a couple more days. It is muddy up here. As soon as it dries out a bit I will be able to use the grader and tractor to start working the roads. Hopefully, we can get a professional grader operator to help out this year. We have a culvert that has popped up a bit at the intersection of Ellison and Deer Trail. Please drive slowly over it. I am hoping it has not caved in. If it has, it will need to be replaced. Again, I am waiting for things to dry out a bit to assess the damage. Hopefully we will be able to take care of some of the rocks that seem to be popping up here and there on Ellison.

We should have a nice, green spring and early summer so I hope you have a chance to come up and enjoy!

EQUIPMENT

Here we go. To recap the equipment report for this quarter, things are looking good for the spring start up this year. The charging issue with the John Deere tractor has been resolved by Potestio Brothers in Colorado Springs. They did have some trouble getting to the ranch house to pick up the unit. The return trip was uneventful. The road grader seems to be doing well. Spoke to our main operator (Steveo) for any concerns that he had and from that conversation I ordered a matched pair of fan belts. I will install them on or about FOC Men's Retreat. Also covered with him where to add motor oil if necessary. On the right hand side of the engine towards the front there is an approximately 1 and 1/4 inch cap on the front cover. A funnel will be needed. Although still not easy to get to but is the only realistic option. The walk behind the brush mower needs to be washed off and all of the fluids checked. The brush mower will be ready to go after that. Looks like LV Ranch clean up will be off to a great start. Looking forward to a really good 2021 summer.

COLUMBARIUM

All remains the same in the columbaria area. We have the two columbaria along with a beautiful bench for reflection. We are hoping to have the third and final columbarium installed this summer. Our little pine trees continue to grow! We do have an interment scheduled mid-June, so please be aware and respect the family's privacy. They have also reserved the Ranch House that day. Please be sure to check the Ranch House schedule for availability.

If you would like LVR to be your earthly resting place, there are several spaces available. The first columbarium has half a niche remaining. The second columbarium has seven niches available. The third columbarium has 12 niches available. Niches are 11 1/4" (w) x 11 1/4" (h) x 10 1/2" (d). Standard size cremation containers are 6" (w) x 8" (h) x 4" (d). The cost of a niche has not gone up over the years. A niche (which holds two sets of cremains) is \$1000. Half a niche (for one set of cremains) can be reserved for \$500. If you are interested in reserving a niche, the application forms are available on the Ranch website or from Dee Paulson at dplakewood@comcast.net.
