FIREHOUSE NEWS AND NOTES

The fire season has not really started for this year and there have already been several wild fires both in Teller County and up and down the Front Range. The Ranch needs the help of all members to mitigate the spread of any small fires that could occur out here in our local area. We are using our roads as fire breaks. To provide an adequate break, we need all members to clear all deadwood and slash from the first 15 feet of the roads bordering their lot. Please place the slash in a clearing and not under power lines where it can be burned next winter. If you have any question on how to stack the slash or where to place it please contact Todd over at the Retreat. He will be glad to help you with where to place it.

Another mitigation task for all members is to move any fire wood away from structures. This is an ongoing problem for the fire department and is a common cause for structure fires associated with a forest fire.

Be safe and do drown your campfire in this year's very dry camping season!

VOLUNTEERISM AT LV RANCH

You may not know that many lots have 3 or 4 generations that still maintain and use their lot, for camping and fishing.

In the past it was common for every member to give back in some way to LVR. Maybe it was mowing the grass around the Ranch House, fixing a retaining wall or rock pathway, driving the tractor to work the roads or spring cleaning the Ranch House. Whatever the task, it was a way for each member to give a small amount of their time and talents for the overall good of the Ranch and its community. Today, we are still united by a common faith in Jesus our Lord and Savior and our enjoyment of His countless and generous blessings, among them is this slice of Colorado mountain country that we have been entrusted with.

LV RANCH SECONDARY MEMBERSHIP RIGHTS AND SUCCESSION

In order to become an LV Ranch Member, an initial membership application was first required to be completed by a qualifying Lutheran Missouri Synod individual or a married couple. Upon approval, the individual or married couple then became the Primary Member(s) of a specified membership lot. The initial membership application included a section where Secondary Members (typically the individual or couple's children) could be designated with respect to their membership and lot. This designation of Secondary Membership will allow those family members designated to someday apply to become the Primary Member(s) with respect to the membership and lot.

Even without a Secondary Membership designation, the spouse and children of a Primary Member(s) have full usage rights concerning the lot and the LV Ranch facilities, but they do not necessarily have any future rights to assume primary responsibility for the LV Ranch membership. As certain as we are about paying taxes, someday each Primary Member(s) will no longer be capable of taking care of LV Ranch membership matters. Designating one or more family member(s) as Secondary Member(s) will help to ease the process of future lot and membership succession (helping to make sure that the membership stays within the same family, if so desired.)

Secondary Member(s) can be designated in the original membership application. Using that same form that's available in our website (lvranch.org), Secondary Member(s) can also be designated at a later point in time by the Primary Member(s). All that you need do is to fill out the form with the required signatures and return it to the LV Ranch Board along with the nominal Secondary Membership application fee.

EQUIPMENT

COLUMBARIUM

If you would like LVR to be your earthly resting place, there are several spaces available in the Ranch columbaria. The first columbarium has half a niche remaining. The second columbarium has six niches available. The third columbarium has 12 niches available. Niches are 11 1/4" (w) x 11 1/4" (h) x 10 1/2" (d). Standard size cremation containers are 6" (w) x 8" (h) x 4" (d). The cost of a niche (which holds two sets of cremains) is \$1000. Half a niche (for one set of cremains) can be reserved for \$500. If you are interested in reserving a niche, the application forms are available on the Ranch website or from Dee Paulson at dplakewood@comcast.net.
