BUILDINGS & SAFETY

Another summer at our beloved LVR has come and gone. New buildings are up, driveways cut, and electricity/wells are in. Folks are obeying the speed limits and closing the gate as requested. Things are good at LVR!

We've been working to understand why Bear Lake is dry after last year's excellent snowfall and quite a bit of rain in the summer. The board has approved engagement with two water engineering firms to consult on ways to refill the lake. Preliminary discussions indicate it could be one or all of these causes... Bentonite layer was compromised by 4 wheeling in the lake bed the last major drought, Muskrat holes, Aspens choking the water source, or Tile from spring is plugged. Recent snowfall has delayed our meetings, but the plan is to get as much information before winter so we're ready to act in the spring.

LAKES, TREES AND WILDLIFE UPDATE

As of this writing, the fair weather months of 2019 have come and gone at LV Ranch, and the daylight hours have now shortened. I expect that the bears in our area are now settled down for the winter. There was at least one bear that proved to be troublesome for outdoor trash containers this past spring, but no RV damage was reported.

For the benefit of those newer members, LV Ranch did experience some significant bear-related problems a few years back. Several RVs were broken into, and they caused quite a bit of inside damage clawing around for a meal.

The best precaution to take to prevent unwanted attention from bears is to store no food or garbage (including dog and bird feeder food) inside of your RV, and most particularly while you are away. I've been told that a bear can smell the scent of potential food for up to five miles away.

While camping, it is also wise to keep your food items stored safely in a vehicle (between meals) with the vehicle windows fully closed. Many folks have discovered an unwelcome surprise by leaving a vehicle window down even a small bit. The prying strength of a bear's legs and claws are no match for any slightly opened vehicle window.

It's also wise to place 'bear boards' on the ground outside of all RV and shed doors and windows when you are away. A 'bear board' is essentially a section of plywood with screws drilled into it from the bottom up with an inch or so of the sharp points sticking up. Most bears decide that's not a good place to walk J.

It was another great year for fishing at Deer Lake. Deer Lake is stocked with an assortment of differing sized trout once before Memorial Day, and again before the Annual Meeting in early August. While many enjoy the sport of fishing as a 'catch and release' activity, just as many have discovered how good freshly caught trout tastes when cooked on a barbeque grill.

Seeming gale-force winds stripped a great many of the golden Aspen leaves off of the trees in our area while they were still changing colors this year, so the fall colors did not seem nearly as spectacular as it had been in past years, alas.

COLUMBARIUM

Last November (2018) our second columbarium was installed. We had our first internment a week later. In September we had several engravings done on the first & second columbariums. Wilhelm Monument Company did a great job on the engravings. There will be several internments next Spring and Summer, so please respect privacy when needed. Our third and final columbarium has already arrived! Will wonders never cease? However, since winter has set in in Colorado, installment will have to wait till next Spring. The first columbarium has half a niche remaining. The second columbarium has eight niches available. The third columbarium has 12 niches available. The cost of a niche (which holds two sets of cremains) is \$1000. Half a niche (for one set of cremains) can be reserved for \$500. TREASURER'S REPORT

A/R Membership is up because we had more members resign than anticipated.

Insurance went up a significant amount this year. It is hard to project what the rate of increase will be for the coming year.

We are continuing to have the Ranch House cleaned every other week from Memorial Day to Labor Day. In order to continue current services available at the Ranch House we had to replace the refrigerator, coffee maker, toaster and smoke alarm. We also got new furnace filters, ice machine filters and defibrillator battery pack.

The septic system backed up into the Fire Station restroom in the fall of 2018. We had to have the pipes cleaned out that go into the septic tank, call in a hazardous material cleanup company to clean up the mess and have the restroom walls repainted. Please limit the amount of toilet paper you put in the toilet. **Please** do not flush any paper towels, feminine products or Kleenex down the toilet. The problem was a wade of paper products that did not make it to the septic tank.

The grader required extensive maintenance work this past year to keep it in working condition.
